#### MISCELLANEOUS.

(f) Handling. (1) Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.  
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Inspectors reviewed records pertaining to an adult female rhesus macaque housed with her infant. On 29 March 2013, the squeeze restraint mechanism was partially activated in order for caretaker staff to record the infant's body temperature. The adult female's arm became entrapped between the squeeze mechanism and a closed enrichment door. The animal forcibly removed her arm and subsequently fractured it. The animal received immediate and appropriate veterinary care. Animals must be expeditiously and carefully handled in order to prevent injury. The facility must ensure that all animals are handled in a manner which prevents trauma and/or physical harm.  
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Correct by: This incident was reported to the IACUC and corrective measures have been taken.

### 3.80 (a) (2) (ii)

#### PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Primary enclosures for nonhuman primates must meet the following minimum requirements: (a) General requirements. (2) Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they:(ii) Protect the nonhuman primates from injury;  
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Inspectors reviewed records pertaining to a female rhesus macaque. On 2 July 2013, this animal's left hand became entrapped in the space between the bottom portion of a metal conduit and the corn crib portion of the enclosure. The animal was injured and subsequently expired. All primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained in a manner which protects the animals from injury. The facility must alter, repair or replace the aforementioned enclosure, and develop a maintenance plan to ensure that all enclosures protect the animals housed in the enclosure from injury.

## Inspection Report

3.80 (a) (2) (iii)

### PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Primary enclosures for nonhuman primates must meet the following minimum requirements:(a) General requirements. (2) Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they: (iii) Contain the nonhuman primates securely and prevent accidental opening of the enclosure, including opening by the animal;

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Inspectors reviewed records which indicated that on 19 January 2013, five capuchin monkeys removed the latch clip from their enclosure door, and escaped from their enclosure. A latch clip is not an effective method of securing an enclosure housing non-human primates. The facility must ensure that all enclosures and latches are constructed and maintained in order to contain the animals securely, and prevent accidental opening of the enclosure.

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Correct by: This incident was reported to the IACUC and corrective measures have been taken.

This routine inspection was conducted on 6 August 2013 and 7 August 2013. An exit interview was conducted with facility representatives on 8 August 2013.
