University of Colorado, Boulder Negligence Kills Multiple Animals, Breaks Federal Law; Watchdog Group Files Federal Complaint

BOULDER, CO – Internal University of Colorado, Boulder correspondence – never expected to be made public – has revealed the deaths of three animals caused by negligence in university laboratories, all federal crimes.

SAEN, an Ohio-based nonprofit that monitors U.S. research facilities for violations of law and animal abuse, said it has uncovered the deaths at the University of Colorado – Boulder’s letters that admit the wrongdoing and negligence to a federal funding agency.

SAEN has filed an Official Complaint with the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture, making allegations of both inadequate veterinary care and unqualified staff against the University of Colorado, Boulder, both federal crimes.

The complaint seeks the maximum penalty against the university, \$10,000 per infraction/per animal.

According to the University of Colorado – Boulder correspondence, two voles died from not being provided water, and one vole died from a crushed skull.

“We believe the University of Colorado, Boulder should face the maximum penalty,” said Stacey Ellison, Research Analyst, SAEN. “The university’s negligence caused innocent animals to suffer and die.”
